
Halala Nontutuzelo Tyulu, Halala!

These goods will not only enhance her business operations but also drive growth.

LAYING A STRONG **EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION!**

With a passion for working with young minds and a firm believer in children having the right to receive good foundational education, Masego Tlhageng, a beneficiary of the Matla A Bokone Solar Scholarship Programme, has successfully achieved a Bachelor of Education Degree in Foundation Phase from the University of the Free State.

Since its inception five years ago, the programme has provided financial and academic support to students from multiple communities within a 50km radius of the solar plant, enabling future educators like Masego to make a lasting impact.
