

CAREER GUIDANCE & LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT: **PHASE 2**

We successfully completed Phase 2 of our Career Guidance and Leadership Development Programme in collaboration with the Department of Education.

This quarter, we delivered training modules to more than one thousand (1 000) Grade 9 learners across six beneficiary high schools in our communities. The training modules focused on helping learners gain a better understanding of themselves, make informed subject choices, and map out their future journeys.

The feedback from the learners has been positive, with Jeremaya Costa, from Tshireleco High School, saying, "I learned that I have to understand the subjects I want to choose as choosing the wrong subjects can affect my career choices."

PINK DIGNITY BAGS - GIRL PRIDE INITIATIVE

As part of a 'Girl Pride' initiative, we provided One thousand (1 000) grade 8 girl learners, across 10 high schools in our beneficiary communities, with Pink Dignity Bags.

Each bag contained six packets of sanitary towels, designed to last up to six months. The goal of this initiative is to positively impact the psychological, physical, and emotional well-being of these girls, as well as to encourage and assist young girls to stay in school during their monthly periods.

The beneficiary high schools included: Thomelang, Pescodia, Platfontein, Greenpoint, Homevale, Emmanelle, Thabane, Emang Mmogo, Vuyolwethu, and EP Lekhela High School.

Additionally, this socio-economic development initiative contributed to stimulating a Young Woman-in-Business local SMME, achieving double the impact.

EMPOWERING LEARNERS WITH NEW SCHOOL BAGS



One thousand (1 000) grade 1 learners, from across 10 schools in the Sol Plaatje Local Municipal area, have once again received brand new school bags for the third consecutive year.

This initiative aims to increase self-esteem and make them feel important, empowering them to succeed academically.
